Otley Ukulele Orchestra was established by Jennifer Pugh in 2012, expanding over the years so that it now regularly has 35 or more people at its weekly sessions. "The ukulele is such an accessible and versatile instrument" says Jennifer, "some of the group started as beginners, others are experienced musicians - we're open to all. PHOENIX CONCERT BAND



Phoenix Concert Band is a large wind orchestra with players from Leeds and the surrounding area, led by acclaimed Musical Director, Keiron Anderson. We play a rich variety of music from film and musical theatre to swing and popular classics, and perform throughout the year for local concert seasons, fundraising events and private engagements.

LEEDS FIDDLE FOLK

Leeds Folk Fiddle Group originated as a violin class focused on folk music. Over the years they have become regular performers at local music scene. They play varied repertoire of traditional English, Scottish and Irish folk music such as jigs, reels and hornpipes which is often enriched by slow airs and folk ballads. The group has experimented with genres such as Klezmer and Eastern European folk and can also play Gypsy music and American folk. Some players have years of experience while others started to learn a couple of years ago.



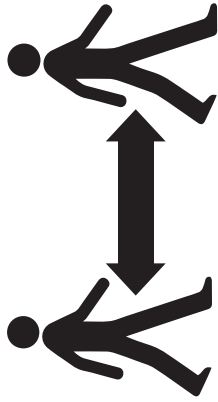
CRAGG HILL BLUES BAND



Cragg Hill Blues Band is a six-piece band of local amateur musicians who came together through their involvement in the Horsforth Music Centre (HMC) and a love of blues music.

Members include: Tracey on drums, Tom on bass, Ian on guitar, Bev on alto sax, Chris on tenor sax and Colin on guitar, harmonica and vocals. We play the type of rhythm and blues that originated in the USA and was particularly popular in the 1960s and 70s, and the inspiration for the formation of bands such as the Rolling Stones and Fleetwood Mac'.

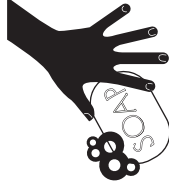
